We are committed to ensuring a safe work, living and learning environment for all. This protocol is a critical component to meeting that commitment, as it allows us to proactively share information and advice and to use the broad range of expertise held by our community partners to provide the appropriate supports to individuals.

Two independent advisory teams have been established to help identify and respond to these situations and liaise with our community partners: The [Students of Concern Advisory Team](#) specifically for student issues, and for faculty and staff, the [Employee of Concern Advisory Team](#).
